Palliative Care

For patients at any stage of a serious illness still pursuing curative treatment.

HMSA Supportive Care

For patients with advanced stage 3 or 4 cancer, Class III or IV congestive heart failure, or advanced COPD.

Hospice Care

For patients with a life-limited prognosis not pursuing curative treatment.

All Islands Hospice patients have access to 24-hour nurse and hospice physician consultations and visits, hospice-related medications and medication delivery; hospice-related medical equipment and supplies; assistance with personal care; general inpatient, continuous and respite care; and bereavement and spiritual counseling.

Who is eligible?

Islands Hospice provides services to individuals who have been given a life-limiting prognosis of six months or less and are seeking comfort vs aggressive curative treatments. Specific eligibility criteria is typically based on the patient’s primary diagnosis as well as contributing conditions. Common diagnosis may include cancer, pulmonary disease, Alzheimer’s/dementia, renal disease, HIV, or liver disease.



Who pays for hospice?

The benefits of hospice care are covered by Medicare and most insurance plans. However, Islands Hospice provides services to hospice-eligible patients, regardless of ability to pay.

Where is hospice provided?

Islands Hospice provides support to individuals and families wherever they call home. This can include a patient’s home or apartment, inpatient unit, nursing home, assisted living facility, friend or relative’s house, or one of our hospice homes on O‘ahu or Maui.

Levels of Care



Respite

Short-term relief for in-home care givers.

Inpatient Care

Short-term general care for patients during a hospital stay.



Continuous Care

Short-term pain or symptom management usually provided in the home.

Routine Home Care

The most common level of hospice care, usually provided in the home.
